We have received overwhelming response for our WhatsApp campaign and were inundated with applications. We received a total of 109 scholarship application requests during this academic year, out of which, 29 students supplied all the documents necessary for us to advance their applications to screening stage. During screening, we found that 7 candidates did not meet the eligibility criteria and we have granted scholarships to 20 qualified students. One can observe that our application and screening process are robust in helping us identify most deserved students out of the application pool and to ensure that donations are spent for the cause our donors

In August, I visited India on a personal vacation. I always make it a point to visit our student's houses during my vacation. The visit serves two important purposes. One, to validate the information provided by the student in their application, and two, to gauge student's interests, point them to useful resources and motivate them to succeed.

Throughout the year, majority of my time is spent doing administrative work to keep the organization operating in compliance with IRS regulations. To be honest, this is extremely demanding and a bit boring. In my 15 years, I have watched several youngsters, with their hard work and commitment, crawl out of severe economic condition to prosperity. This is best part of my job, the opportunity to interact with these bright young kids, listen to their aspirations and helping them materialize their dreams.

In my earlier trips, I was able to visit at least 80% of our students. However, as our student population is growing (which is a good), I am unable to visit all of them in single trip. However, I had planned my trip around Khammam, Krishna and Guntur districts and coincidentally, majority of our students are from these areas. So, despite of my short trip, I was able to travel to meet 31 students over 4 days.

After having listened to students and their family members and having observed several families living conditions, my faith in our work is reinforced. In some cases, I have advised students and pointed them to resources that can help enrich their learning and, in some cases, they taught me about the topics they are pursuing. They are building websites, apps, robots, and working part time, volunteering, coaching kids. Listening to them talk about their dreams, with absolutely no platform to launch from, is an inspiration for me. I am happy to be a small part of their success. Our donors have contributed big in enabling their success. I would like to encourage them to experience this joy personally, not only monetarily, but by connecting with students in person. The feeling is beyond words.
